KL's heritage revitalisation continues this month with the reopening of the Pejabat Pos Besar Lama - the Old General Post Office building. This was Malaya's third post office and until that time, the telegraph office and post office had been sharing space in the Secretariat - Bangunan Sultan Abdul Samad - next door. Originally opened in 1907 at a cost of \$100,000 Straits dollars, this beautiful building is a new cultural and culinary destination showcasing proudly Malaysian retail, food and beverage brands, including Tannin Hill, which Enak! visited a while ago at the invitation of our member Carole.

Those who were at the AGM and heard the fascinating talk from Dr Ceelia Leong of ThinkCity, will be aware that this is one of the next stages of the exciting rejuvenation of heritage buildings in Kuala Lumpur and other cities.

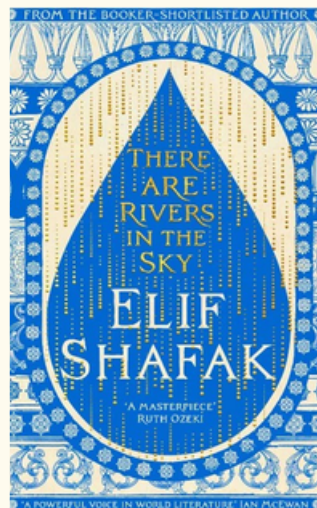
